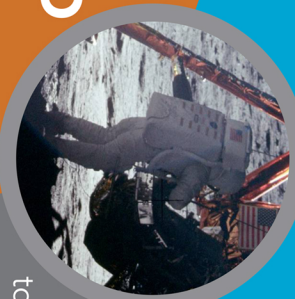




APOLLO 11

Neil Armstrong piloted the lunar module, The Eagle, to land on the Moon.

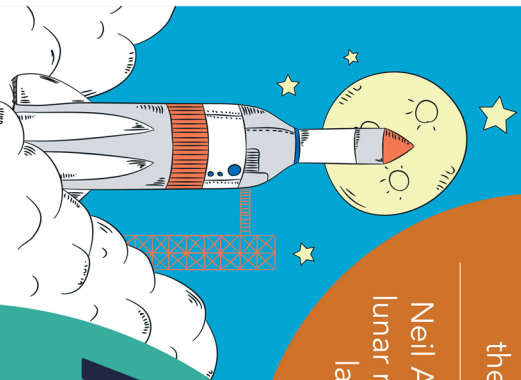


MAN ON THE MOON

NEIL ARMSTRONG

Neil Armstrong was born in the USA in 1930. He first went on a plane when he was 6 and he became very interested in flying. He got his pilot's licence when he was 16.



SCIENCE ON THE MOON

Armstrong and Aldrin spent about two and a half hours on the Moon's surface. They took photographs, collected rocks and soil, and set up scientific equipment.



SAFELY HOME

The Eagle took off from the Moon and rejoined the rocket that Michael Collins was piloting around the moon. They returned to Earth, landed in the Pacific Ocean and were picked up by a US Navy ship.



BRAVE EXPLORER

When he returned to Earth, Neil Armstrong was given medals to celebrate his bravery and to show that he was an American hero. After Armstrong, only eleven more men, all American, walked on the Moon.

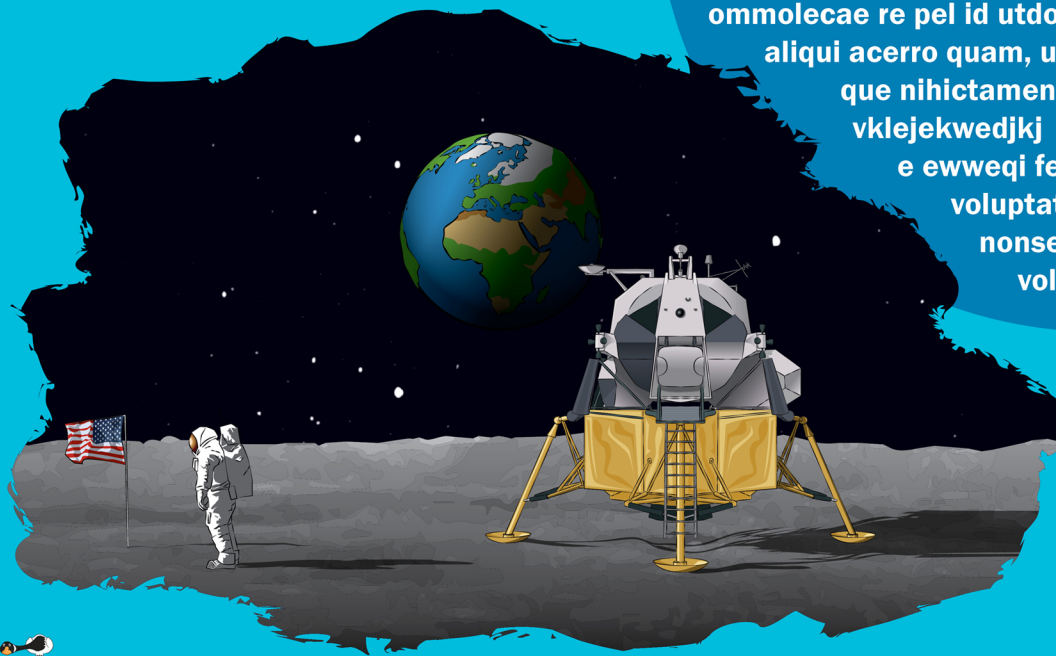

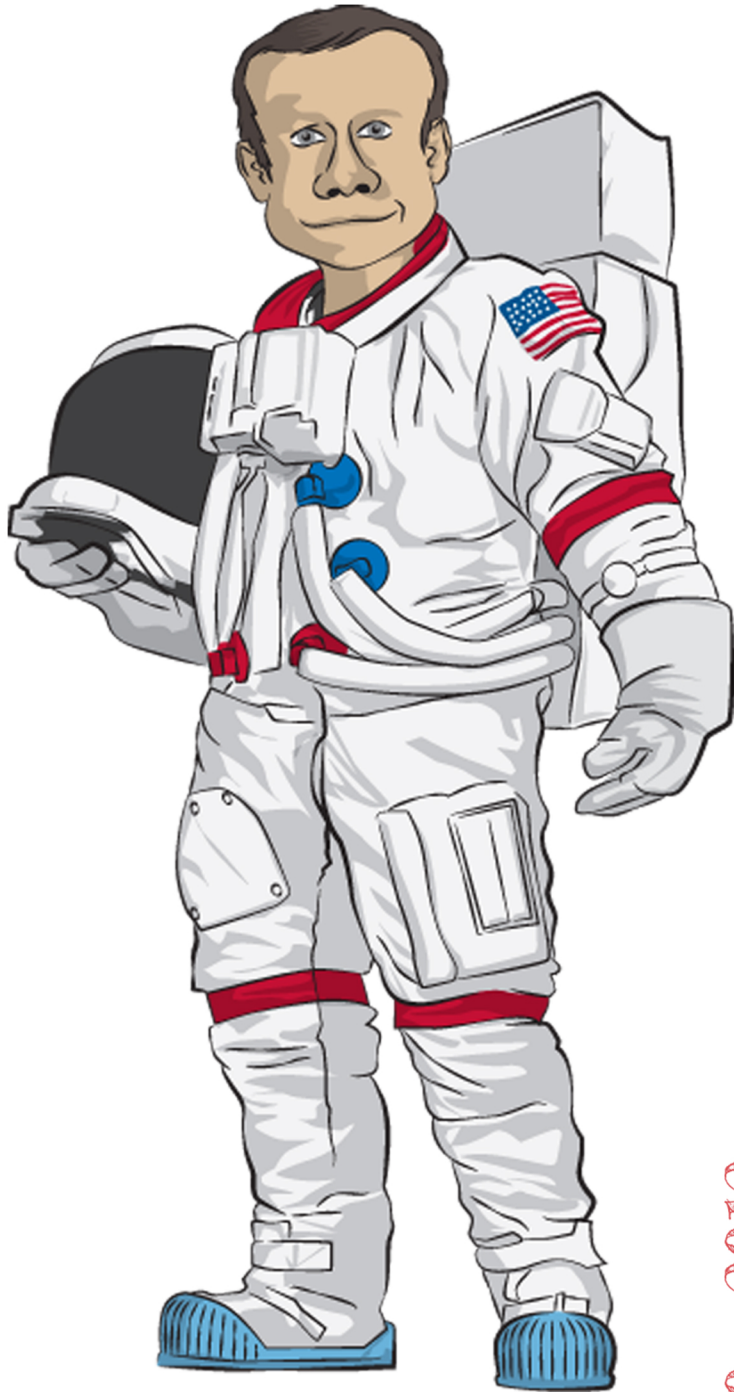

- On July 21st 1969 Neil Armstrong was the first human to step foot on to the moon's surface .
- He famously said "That's one small step for [a] man, one giant leap for mankind" as he took his first step
- He and his co-pilot Buzz Aldrin spent about two and a half hours on the surface of the moon, taking photographs and collecting rocks and soil.
- He was the commander of the Apollo 11 space mission. Other Apollo missions followed, with five more moon landings. Only twelve men, all American, have walked on the moon.
